#### Kasakhstan Tajikistan Uzbekistan

Uzbekistan has an



extensive national crafts and arts. This includes engraving on copper,

wood, and plaster-based material; jeweler's arts; carpet making; ceramics; ornamental embroidery, gold embroidery; decorative currying of tanned leather; silk spinning; making of decorative braids; inlaid works on musical instruments; painting on papier-mache; creation of decorative boxes for local tobacco; baskets, cradles, chests, and many other types.

Kazakhstan's women have good skills in needle work and embroidery. Making yurts, felt products, woolen products, traditional clothes and accessories are just few to mention. Their men are expert in producing wooden crafts, silverware and bone artifacts. Assembling accessories made of gold, silver, jade and semi-precious stones are also their talents.





In Tajikistan, they created wonderful monuments to

carving, fragments of ancient embroidery, grand paintings and other pieces. Presently, their towns have produced weavers, potters, stoves, and metalworkers. Some of their olden handicrafts have been preserved particularly their embroidery. It may be seen on the waist shawls, women's dresses, embroidered skullcaps and on everyday domestic clothes.

# Turkmenistan



Many types of carpets, felts, embroideries, robes, head-dress, jewelries, horse decorations, products made of leather are just some of the arts and crafts of the Turkmen.

Carpet weaving is the most settled and successful in this country and has been recognized all around the world. Carpets were extremely important for the Turkmen. They use this for covering their wagon floors and making folding walls. It also protects them

from the cold weather in their country. They have a wide array of materials used and ways of decoration.



Many years have passed, Kyrgyz's arts and

crafts have changed and have been influenced by the nomadic way of life because of its people's daily needs. They are famous in making mats. These mats are produced from woven straw or "*chiy*". Threads of colorful wool are also added. Kyrgyz make dinnerware, chests and boxes, racks and cases, special chess and backgammon and musical instruments.
