Brief Introduction

THE PERFECT TENSES OF VERB ARE:

1. The Present Perfect Tense - shows an action or condition that began in the past and continues into the present.

Example: Dan has called every day this week.

2. The Past Perfect Tense - shows an action or condition in the past that came before another action or condition in the past.

Example: Dan had called before Ellen arrived.

3. The Future Perfect Tense - shows an action or condition in the future that will occur before another action or condition in the future.

Example: Dan will have called before Ellen arrives.

To form the present perfect, past perfect, and future perfect tenses, add has, have, had, or will have to the past participle.

TENSES	SINGULAR	PLURAL
PRESENT PERFECT TENSE Has or Have + past participle	I have worked. You have worked. He/ She/ It has worked.	We have worked. You have worked. They have worked.
PAST PERFECT TENSE Had + past participle	I had worked. You had worked. He/ She/ It had worked.	We had worked. You had worked. They had worked.
FUTURE PERFECT TENSE Will + Have + past participle	TENSE I will have worked. You will have worked.	

We use YOU to refer to the listener or reader. It is both the subject and the object form. You can refer to one person or more than one person. It is usually clear from the context whether YOU is singular or plural:

Remember

- We form the present-perfect tense by using the present tense of have (has or have) and adding the past participle of the main verb
- We form the past-perfect tense by taking the past tense of have (had) and adding the past participle of the main verb.
- The future perfect tense is formed by taking the future tense of have (will have) and adding the past participle of the main verb. The future-perfect tense refers to an action that will be completed at some definite time in the future.
