BRIEF INTRODUCTION

What is Tempo

Some music move slowly and some move fast. The speed of the beat of the music refers to TEMPO. Tempo can range from very slow to very fast. (Enjoying Life Through MAPEH page 12) Below are different kinds of tempo written in Italian words and their meaning that can be found in a musical composition.

Practice slowly and evenly "connecting" the chords so they "flow" from one to the next with no silences between them . . . observe fingering and position marks!



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
REMEMBER
