LOOKING BACK TO YOUR LESSON

Tempo is the speed or pace of a given piece. In classical music, tempo is typically indicated with an instruction at the start of a piece and is usually measured in beats per minute.


BRIEF INTRODUCTION

The general quality of one layer of sound or numerous layers of sound heard at the same time is called **Texture.** It maybe thick or thin that describes the overall quality of a sound. Musical arrangements are also well expressed through several layers of sound. It is the lightness or heaviness of the sound.

Kinds of TEXTURE MONOPHONIC

Monophonic texture or one voice is the simplest type of musical texture. It consists of a single melodic line without any accompaniment. It can also be "a solo singing" or being sung by many in "unison", when two or more people play or sing the same pitch.



Homophonic texture is a composition with a single melodic line accompanied by a musical instrument. The focus is given on the relationship of the main melody and on the accompaniment and when the melody is accompanied by **chords** or by **human voice** or by an **instrument like a guitar or piano**.

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POLYPHONIC



Polyphonic texture "many sounds" describes a musical texture in which two or more independent melodies of equal importance are performed simultaneously. This kind of texture is frequently used in canon or round or choral.
