#### HARMONY: Primary chords of Major and minor keys

##### EXPECTATIONS:

You will learn to respond to the sound you hear by using the appropriate chord and identify the chords in accompanying a major key. This module will help you to:

1. Identify the primary chords of G Major and F Major.
2. Harmonize simple melodies using the primary chords.
3. Play the primary chords in a musical piece using a musical instrument.

##### BRIEF INTRODUCTION:

Below are the primary chords of some major scales:

##### Steps in harmonizing simple melodies:

1. Identify the key signature of the song. The song “Harana sa Bukid,” is in the key of C Major.
2. In the key of C Major the primary chords are C, F, and G chords.
3. Analyze and check the notes in every measure. If the notes are similar with certain chords, most likely, that chord may be used to harmonize the piece and played as accompaniment to the specific melody in every measure.
4. Write the possible primary chords below the first note of each measure. The red asterisks indicate to change the next chord.

2. On your Music notebook, discuss the relevance of Harmony in your life.

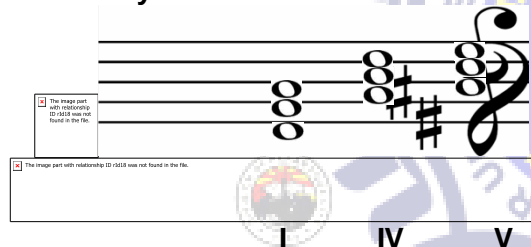

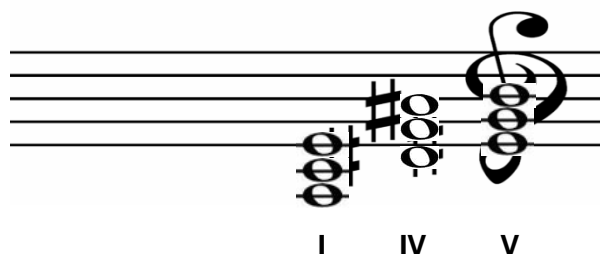
