

Kapampangans take great pride in the Sinukwan Festival, which gives them a chance to honor and preserve their rich cultural identity. It offers a chance to pass on knowledge about Pampanga's history, customs, and values to both the locals and visitors, strengthening the sense of continuity and community. With time, the event has developed into a cherished custom that cheers up and celebrates the Kapampangans and helps them get through difficult times like the Mount Pinatubo explosion and the Lahar in the 1990s. SUB-TOPIC: Featured Art Forms in the Sinukwan Festival

Understanding

1. Explicitation

• Traditional Kapampangan Music and Dance

The well-known Kapampangan song "Atin Cu Pung Singsing" sets the tone for the Sinukwan Festival. It is a traditional piece from the Kapampangan people that has been handed down through the ages.

Atin Cu Pûng Singsing is a consecrated song for Kapampángan revolutionaries. The ring mentioned in the song represents Kapampángan Aláya. It refers to the intangible, universal, metaphysical, and infinite, also known as life force or spirit. Our aláya, like the ring in the song, is an essential component of our identity. It reminds us of our Kapampángan roots and the need to preserve our culture, language, and everything else since nothing remains of our Kapampángan identity without these.

• Costume and Prop Design for the Sinukwan Festival

The dancers wear brightly colored headdresses (large crowns) with bright, dazzling accessories and costume designs reflecting the region's rich tapestry, enhancing the visual spectacle.










• Storytelling and oral traditions in the Sinukwan Festival

The Sinukwan Festival outlines its roots in the Kapampangan god of ancient mythology, Aring Sinukwan, embodying the region's rich cultural heritage. Aring Sinukwan was the god of agriculture, fertility, and singing. The event was a time for people to gather, celebrate the harvest, and express gratitude to Sinukwan for his favors.

Oral/Unique Traditions, folk beliefs and culture KAPAMPANGAN DEITIES

Living in Mount Arayut and the first inhabitant. in Pampanga, ne was a noble, gigantic being whose countenance reflected, beautiful trads such as royally, windom, faithfulness, ability and love. He is a product of the Kapampangang primordial culture but, in many respects, he serves as a central image in the maintenance of their internal racial affinity as well asin the interaction of their past and present.



He is also known as the Kapampangan sun God of War and Death. In which, the people in the town honors the Kapampangan God by dancing which is actually one of the main highlights or the main highlights or the main activities during the 7th day event period. This event would be called "Sinulowan Festival".
