

Cartoon Character Making

A cartoon is a type of illustration, possibly animated, typically in a non-realistic or semi-realistic style. The specific meaning has evolved over time. but the modern usage usually refers to either: an image of series of images intended for satire, caricature, or humor; or a motion picture that relies on sequence of illustrations for its animation. Someone who creates cartoons in the first sense is called cartoonist, and in the second sense they are usually called an animator.

The concept originated in the Middle Ages, and first described a preparatory drawing for a piece of art, such as a painting, fresco, tapestry, or stained glass window. In the 19th century, beginning in Punch magazine in 1843, cartoon came to refer-ironically at first - to humorous illustrations in magazines and newspapers. In the early 20th century, it began to refer to animated films which resembled print cartoons.

What is It


Origin of Cartoon

What may be seen as possibly the earliest political cartoon is a mysterious woodcut permitted Le Revers du Jeudes Suysses (The Other Side of the Swiss Game), fashioned in 1499. In this, the pope, the Holy Roman Emperor, and the kings of France and England can be seen playing cards while under the table. A swiss soldier heaps the decks in satirical annotations on French ambitions in Italy (the support of elite Swiss soldiers was essential to France).


At about the same time, Pope Alexander VI was potrayed as a devil and in another drawing a Jesuit priest is given a wolf's head. Perhaps the most memorable sketch of this period-and one exactly datable and attributable to a known artist - was an anti-Protestant woodcut by Erhard Schoen of 1521, showing the Devil playing a pair of bagpipes, the bellows of which are depicted as the head of Martin Luther.

A number of other artists of this period also fashioned heavily allegorical and often fantastical drawings which have resonances in the modern cartoon. Conversely, Italy at the hands of the Carracci family and others such as Pier Leone Ghezzi - the first artist to earn a living solely by this kind of work-that the modern cartoon can be said to have been molded.

It was also in Italy that these early comic strips flourished, and almost uniquely so until collections of such drawings (especially those of Ghazi) found their way across Europe, and Hogarth began his sequence of “modern moral subjects” in England in the 1730s.


What is It

Types of Cartoons

There are basically five types of Cartoon Drawings:

- a. **Gag Cartoon** – is a single-panel cartoon usually including a caption beneath a drawing.
- b. **Comic Strip Cartoon** – is a sequence of drawings in boxes that tell an amusing story, typically printed in a newspaper or comic book.
- c. **Animated Cartoon** – is a motion picture that is made from a series of drawings, computer graphics, or photographs or inanimate objects (such as puppets) and that stimulates movement by slight progressive changes in each frame.
- d. **Editorial Cartoon** – is also known as a political cartoon, an illustration or comic strip containing a political or social message, that usually relates to current events or personalities.
- e. **Illustrative Cartoon** – portrays specific ideas in a direct and simple manner. They help in explaining stories, teaching aids or advertisement.


