In Asia, festivals and theatrical plays reflect peoples' culture by portraying their way of life through movements, costumes, and musical accompaniment inherent to their place of origin. To deftly critique and practice your chosen art form through the elements like color, form, line, shape, space, and texture are the building blocks or foundations upon which a work of art is created. They are the tools artists use when creating an artwork. The principles of design are how those building blocks are arranged: contrast, rhythm, proportion, balance, unity, emphasis, movement, and variety. They are the ways an artist can organize the elements of art to create a wide range of effects. With your knowledge of these, you will always be able to find the joy and excitement that can surround art, and for art lovers, there is nothing more appealing than that.

In this module, you will discover the basic concepts, elements, and principles of festivals and theater art forms of Asia. specifically of China, Japan, and Indonesia.
