

BRIEF INTRODUCTION

The term *multimedia* comes from two words: *multi* which means multiple or many, and *media* which refers to means of communication. Therefore, multimedia is a combination of many and different types of means of communication.

Multimedia has five elements.



Text – these are words, sentences, and paragraphs, just like what you read in books, newspapers, magazines, text messages and the likes.



Audio – the sound elements. These include the use of speech, music and sound effects.




Video - a recording of moving visual images

Graphics – illustration of ideas through still pictures, tables, graphs and other images



Animation – the process of making a static image look like it is moving



Giving Instructions Using Imperatives

An *imperative* sentence is a type of sentence used when giving a command or instruction. The base form of the verb is used. It can be positive or negative.

Examples:	<u>Positive</u>	<u>Negative</u>
	Go.	Do not go. / Don't go.
	Move.	Do not move. / Don't move.
	Avoid.	Do not avoid / Don't avoid

Activity 3

Narrating factual or personal recounts

Do you know what a **recount** is? To recount is to retell or describe an event or an experience to make the readers or the listeners feel as if they were there.

A recount may be *factual* or *personal*. A <u>factual recount</u> focuses more on the recorded details and facts of a particular event, while a <u>personal recount</u> is one where the writer or the speaker has been personally involved in.

Police reports, news stories, history, biography, and incident reports are factual recounts in the sense that the writer or speaker who is not personally involved in the situation retells the events objectively. It is told in the third person point of view. Therefore, pronouns like *he*, *she*, *they*, *them*, etc. are often used.

On the other hand, diaries, journals, anecdotes, and personal letters are examples of personal recounts. You will notice that the first-person pronouns, *I*, *me*, *our* and *we* are used. Source: https://www.literacyideas.com/recounts
